OVERVIEW

The Angel Tree Hamper Project was launched by Prison Fellowship Singapore (PFS) in 2005 with a vision to bring a message of hope from inmates to their loved ones, in the spirit of Christmas. Over the years, we have witnessed how inmates have found Christ in prison and are transformed by the Word of God. With this initiative, inmates are given an opportunity to seek forgiveness and share with their families how God has touched their lives.

Handwritten letters with powerful messages of hope and reconciliation are written by inmates and are personally delivered with hampers by volunteer church teams to the families. This knitting of hearts not only brings hope and and joy to children vouths with parents in prison, but also opens doors for the restoration of broken relationships between inmates and their loved ones.

Churches and business organisations contribute and bring the love of Christ through donations and dedication of their time and service. The delivery of hampers also provides an opportunity for us to further identify needs of families whom we can help in more ways.

Among juvenile delinquents, boys with hostile fathers commit more crime and use a larger variety of drugs and alcohol than boys with absentee fathers. (Journal of Adolescence, 2018)

Among juvenile delinquents who had completed rehabilitation in 2011, 16.7 per cent re-offended within three years. These juveniles were aged between seven and under-16. (Straits Times, 2018)

PURCHASE OF HAMPER ITEMS

Purchasing is done early to ensure the availability of the chosen hamper products and to be cost efficient. Also, some products require a longer lead time to be manufactured.

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION IN PRISON Registration is open to all beneficiaries who participate in the PFS programmes in prison. Inmates write their letters and submit them to SPS for approval. PFS then converts them into greeting cards to be paired with the hampers.

HAMPER PACKING AND COLLECTION

A partner school opens up their premises and allows their students to contribute their time to pack hamper items into large tote bags and sort them in preparation for hamper distribution. Church volunteers collect hampers at the partner school and form teams to visit the homes of hamper recipients.

Church volunteers unite as a body of Christ to deliver hampers all over the island and bring love into the homes of families of the incarcerated.

Bethesda Pasir Ris Mission Church

We were initially discouraged as we had a difficult time getting in touch with the family member. But I am glad my husband and I continued to pray and not give up, and finally managed to contact her. She was very warm and grateful when she received the hamper. She invited us in, shared that she's a Christian, and even invited my colleague who was with me to her church! I felt encouraged and blessed by her response and how God answered our prayers.

I do not know anyone who has been imprisoned and my knowledge were probably from movies or TV shows. When I delivered the hampers to their families, I was surprised they were like any one of us, ordinary folks. One with a mother and one a son in incarceration. I do not know their stories but I shared the moment when they were connected and touched by a loved one whom they missed. I am glad I joined the ATP.

St James' Church

I started volunteering for the Angel Tree project as an offering to God for His provision of a family car. I had wanted to only help out for 1 year but continued being a volunteer till date. The delight I saw in the children's faces when they received the hampers, the smiles from the recipients when they received the cards written by their loved ones kept me going. Every family I visited had its own struggles and challenges. Christmas is a season of joy and hope, yet not every family gets to experience them. I am glad to be part of Angel Tree project to bring cheers to these families. As long as I have the use of a family car, I will continue to be the messenger of God's love and hope to the families who need them.

It's a pleasure to be able to distribute the hampers and Christmas cards to the families and also to see the smile on their faces and gratitude upon receiving the gift. We hope to spread the love of Jesus through us in this small part of our works.

We felt apprehensive even as we volunteered to deliver our first hamper under the Angel Tree Hamper Project. We did not know what to expect. We prayed on the way there. The moment we met the recipient, we felt at eased. We requested to have a chat, and she led us into her home. She opened up as we conversed, tears swell as she talked about her son. We felt glad when we left. Overall, a heart-warming experience. This was our way to share God's love with a family whose son was in prison. We were glad we volunteered as God's vessel, to bless and to love.

First Time Volunteer

Our CG has been supporting the Angel Tree Hamper project for " several years. Besides seeing this as a way to give back to society, it is also a way we honor our God. As Matt 22:37-40 says we should love our God but it goes on to say we should love our neighbours as we love ourselves. When we bring these gifts to the family, there is always a light of joy in their eyes to receive. It also gives the recipient an assurance his or her family member is doing well despite the environment. Where there are young children of the inmates, it also allows the young child to feel that he or she is being thought of by his or her parent. The gift allows a connection to be made. I remember on one occasion, when the child's grandmother took the hamper, she turned to the toddler and said 妈咪给你喜欢的饼干 That spark on the little boy's face was worth more than a thousand words. When you see the recipient going the extra mile to receive the hamper, you know God is working His magic to restore the lives of the family. The value of PFS can truly be felt by the expression seen on faces.


