OVERVIEW

The Angel Tree Hamper Project was launched by Prison Fellowship Singapore (PFS) in 2005 with a vision to bring a message of hope from inmates to their loved ones, in the spirit of Christmas. Over the years, we have witnessed how inmates have found Christ in prison and are transformed by the Word of God. With this initiative, inmates are given an opportunity to seek forgiveness and share with their families how God has touched their lives.

letters with Handwritten powerful messages of hope and reconciliation are written by inmates and are personally delivered with hampers by volunteer church teams to the families. This knitting of hearts not only brings hope and children and vouths parents in prison, but also opens doors for the restoration of broken relationships between inmates and their loved ones.

Churches and business organisations contribute and bring the love of Christ through donations and dedication of their time and service. The delivery of hampers also provides an opportunity for us to further identify needs of families whom we can help in more ways.





Among juvenile delinquents, boys with hostile fathers commit more crime and use a larger variety of drugs and alcohol than boys with absentee fathers. (Journal of Adolescence, 2018)

Among juvenile delinquents who had completed rehabilitation in 2011, 16.7 per cent re-offended within three years. These juveniles were aged between seven and under-16. (Straits Times, 2018)

85 new Beyond Parental Control cases were filed in 2017, the most since 2009. (TNP, 2018)

PURCHASE OF HAMPER ITEMS

Purchasing is done early to ensure the availability of the chosen hamper products and to be cost efficient. Also, some products require a longer lead time to be manufactured.



SEPT

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION IN PRISON
Registration is open to all beneficiaries who
participate in the PFS programmes in prison. Inmates
write their letters and submit them to SPS for
approval. PFS then converts them into greeting cards
to be paired with the hampers.



NOV

HAMPER PACKING AND COLLECTION

A partner school opens up their premises and allows their students to contribute their time to pack hamper items into large tote bags and sort them in preparation for hamper distribution. Church volunteers collect hampers at the partner school and form teams to visit the homes of hamper recipients.



DEC

VISITS AND HAMPER DELIVERY

Church volunteers unite as a body of Christ to deliver hampers all over the island and bring love into the homes of families of the incarcerated.



JAN

FEEDBACK COLLECTION AND FOLLOW UP

Undelivered hampers are returned to PFS and church volunteers share their experiences to help us improve our processes and solve any issues that arise during the project.




